
5 Styles in a Format Suitable in either SD (4:3/TV) or HD (16:9/Widescreen)

These styles are meant as transitions between two images, either portrait or landscape. Portrait images are sized to fill the screen and so may be use instead of a landscape image. With a portrait image though, often the area of interest is usually not in the middle of the image so you may need to adjust it up or down as appropriate.

4 Sides Fade Rounded**Requires 2 Landscape Images**

Setup: Layer 1 will show after layer 2

Rounded layers fade into view on all four corners and meet up in the screen center. As they do, they reveal the image in layer 1.

4 Sides Fade Squared**Requires 2 Landscape Images**

Setup: Layer 1 will show after layer 2

Rectangular layers fade into view on all four corners and meet up in the screen center. As they do, they reveal the image in layer 1.

Diamond CrossFade**Requires 2 Landscape Images**

Setup: Layer 1 will show after layer 2

Two triangles (diamond halves) meet in the screen center to form a diamond that gets larger and in the process reveals the next image.

Diamond Zoom Fade Out**Requires 2 Landscape Images**

Setup: Layer 1 will show after layer 2

A series of diamond shapes grow from screen center to reveal the next image.

Oval Cross-Fade**Requires 2 Landscape Images**

Setup: Layer 1 will show after layer 2

Oval shapes move to the screen center from the left and right, revealing the next image as they do.
