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5 Styles in SD (4:3) and HD (16:9) Formats Note: small differences may occur between the two formats

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These styles are meant as transitions between two images, either portrait or landscape. Portrait images are sized to fill the screen and so may be use instead of a landscape image. With a portrait image though, often the area of interest is usually not in the middle of the image so you may need to adjust it up or down as appropriate.

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**Corners Rotate 2CW 2CCW****Requires 2 Landscape Images**

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**Setup:** Layer 1 is the next image. Layer 2 is the initially viewed image.

The upper right and lower left quarter rotate clockwise together under the lower right quarter and the upper left quarter respectively. The remaining two corners rotate counter-clockwise under the lower left and upper right quarters, respectively.

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**Corners Rotate Alt CW By 1****Requires 2 Landscape Images**

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**Setup:** Layer 1 is the next image. Layer 2 is the initially viewed image.

The next image is revealed when the upper right quarter rotates under the upper left quarter. Then, the lower left quarter rotates under the lower right quarter. which rotates under the upper right quarter of the next image. Then, the upper left quarter rotates under the lower left quarter of the next image.

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**Corners Rotate CCW****Requires 2 Landscape Images**

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**Setup:** Layer 1 is the next image. Layer 2 is the initially viewed image.

The next image is revealed when the upper left quarter rotates under the lower left quarter which rotates under the lower right quarter which rotates under the upper right quarter which then rotates under the upper left quarter of the next image. So, the next image is revealed one quarter at a time in a counter-clockwise fashion.

## **Corners Rotate CW**

**Requires 2 Landscape Images**

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**Setup:** Layer 1 is the next image. Layer 2 is the initially viewed image.

The next image is revealed when the upper right quarter rotates under the lower right quarter which rotates under the lower left quarter which rotates under the upper left quarter which then rotates under the upper right quarter of the next image. So, the next image is revealed one quarter at a time in a clockwise fashion.

## **Corners Rotate CW Alt Xs**

**Requires 2 Landscape Images**

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**Setup:** Layer 1 is the next image. Layer 2 is the initially viewed image.

The upper right and lower left quarter rotate clockwise together under the lower right quarter and the upper left quarter respectively. The remaining two corners rotate clockwise under the upper right and lower left quarters, respectively.
