Style/Transitions Bundle — Corner Swing Volume A

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8 Styles and 8 Transitions Suitable for Any Aspect Shows In ProShow Producer 4.5 or later

Setup for each Style:

Transitions Require ProShow Producer 4.5+

LAYERS: Layer 1= Initial Image; Layer 2= Next Image

IMAGES: Each of the styles in this bundle needs 2 landscape images (they're used full screen).

Corner Swing 1

The corners rotate at the sides away from each other to reveal the next image.

Corner Swing 2

The corners rotate at top and bottom edges away from each other to reveal the next image

Corner Swing 3a

Two corners rotate from the top and two from the sides away from each other to reveal the next image.

Corner Swing 3b

Two corners rotate from the top and two from the sides away from each other to reveal the next image.

Corner Swing 4a

The corners rotate at the outside edges away from each other to reveal the next image.

Corner Swing 4b

The corners rotate at the outside edges away from each other to reveal the next image.

Corner Swing 5a

The corners rotate at the frame corners away from each other to reveal the next image.

Corner Swing 5b

The corners rotate at the frame corners away from each other to reveal the next image.

NOTES:

Transitions Require ProShow Producer 4.5+

NOTES:

When using this style in a subsequent slide such that it's not apparent that a new slide was used, use one of two following ways to accomplish this: 1) use a similar/counterpart slide transition or 2) apply the style to the subsequent slide and then edit the slide. These directions assume the slide times utilize the recommended time for the style. Recommended times for the transitions are between 2 and 3 seconds.

A) Using a slide transition. Apply your style to each slide using two different images on each slide. On the transition between each slide, apply the appropriate transition. For instance, Slide 1 and Slide 2 both use the Corner Swing 7 style. The transition between Slides 1 and 2 will be Corner Swing 7.

B) When Not using a slide transition.

- 1. Apply the style to a slide containing two different images.
- 2. Create an empty slide.
- 3. Copy the last image of first slide to the new slide and add a new image.
- 4. Now, apply the style to the new slide. Next,
- 5. Set the transition between the two slides to cut.
- 6. Go to next to last layer 2 of the new slide.
- 7. Delete 3 seconds from keyframe 1.
- 8. Delete the layer (it's no longer needed. What was just done was to remove the display time of the initial image so that the transition effect can occur immediately).
- 9. Done!

As you can tell from the instructions above, the use of a transition that utilizes the same effect as the two slides between it saves time and effort and allows for an uninterrupted visual experience.
